 - Configured for stages of the claim
 - State-specific configurations
 - Review images and document packages



Why Use AMR

AMR is a dashboard to view the account based on the task at hand

- Increase efficiency in which reviews are performed
- All data points are configurable
- Unlimited configurations
- Consolidated data views

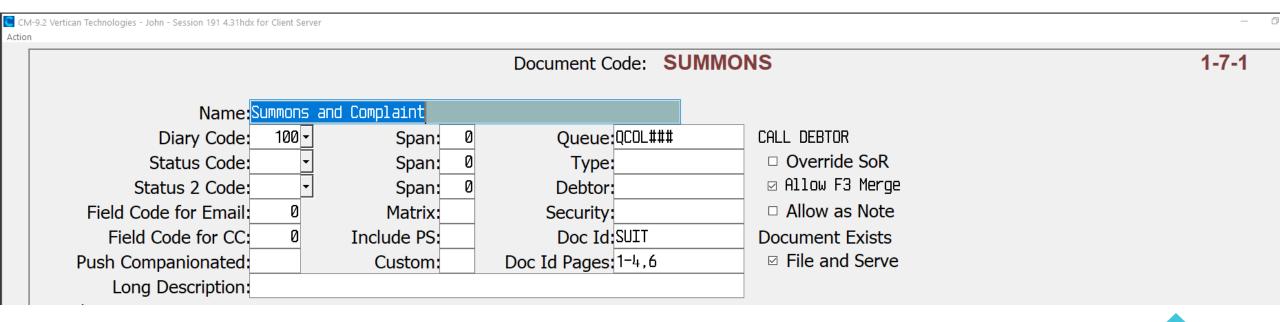
Why Use AMR

AMR is a dashboard to view the account based on the task at hand

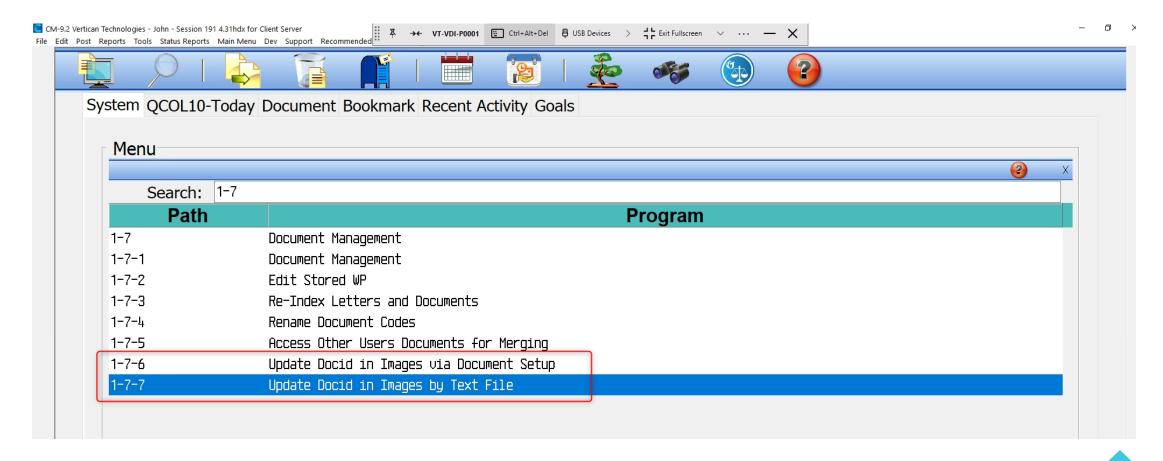
- Record keeping
 - Enhanced logging
 - Records of who did what, and when
 - Detailed AMR PDF report
 - Saved in the Claim Folder
 - Pass/Fail details

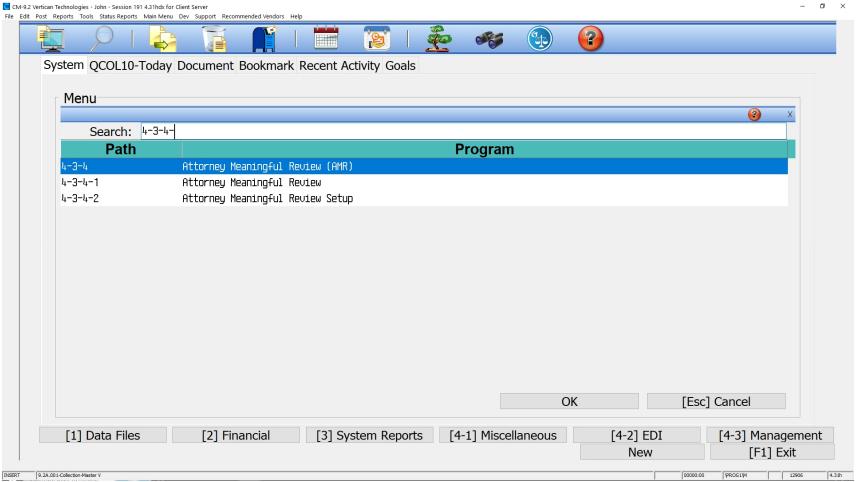
New Collection-Master Concepts

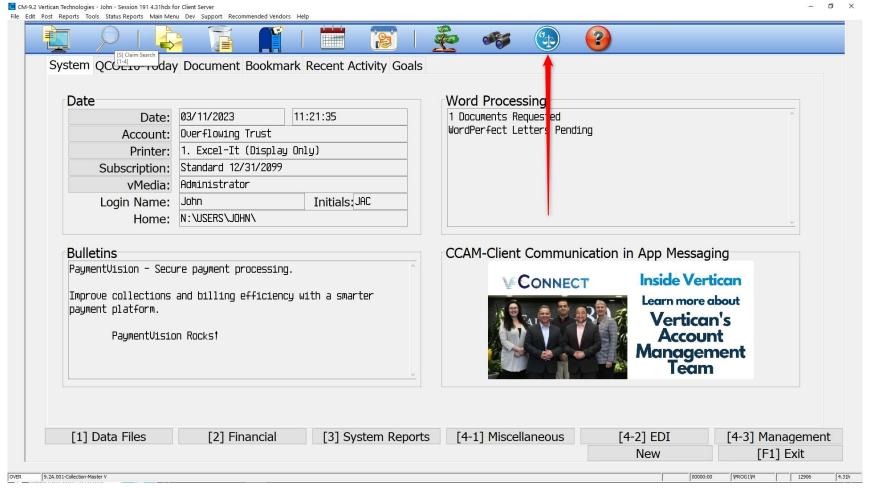
- DOCIDs
 - An identifier or tag to locate specific media

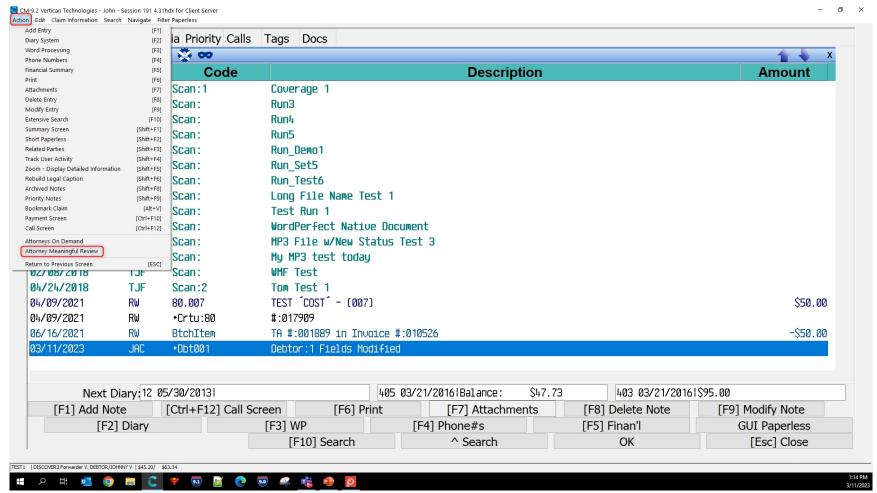


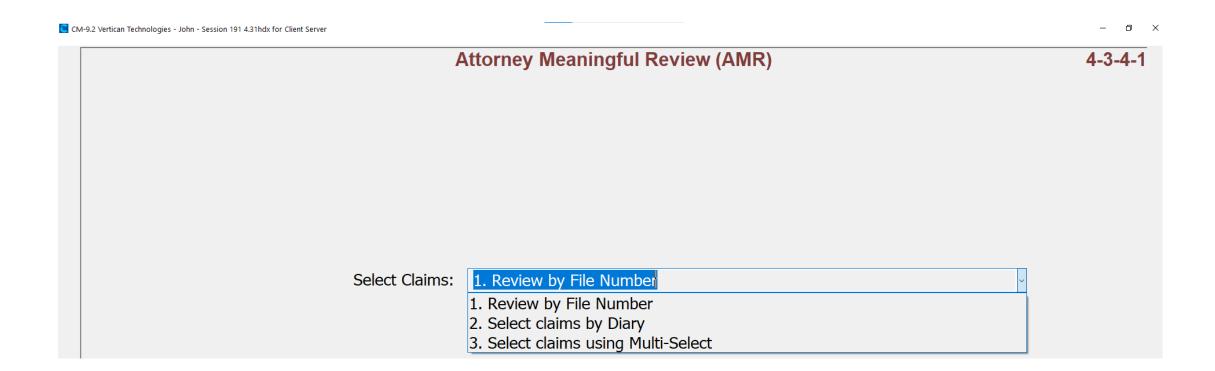

Configuring AMR

AMR Configuration [4-3-4-2]

Groups

- Must be unique
- Consider name groups by Queue

Review type

- Attorney
- Pre-attorney
- Quality control

Staging

• Used to connect Court Documents to stage of claim

Many Uses

- Smart Pre-Filtering by Triggering Smart Documents:
 - So where "this condition" or "that condition", remove any of these QSUIT diaries and add new diaries, send X-codes with elaborate scripts, email someone, etc. to fix whatever is wrong or even close the claim based on circumstance
 - Check the following:
 - Have an affidavit from client
 - No fraud
 - No suit
 - No Payment Plan
 - Last pay date>180
 - Has employer
 - Has bank
 - Owns property
